Fieldhome Honors Its Employees and Its Past

Cortlandt Manor, NY, June 26, 2010 -- On Monday, June 21, 2010, FIELDHOME honored thirty-two of its loyal and dedicated employees and trustees for their many years of service. The ceremony culminates a landmark year that celebrates FIELDHOME's 130th anniversary.



The Employee and Trustee Recognition Ceremony was dedicated to Sister Louise who is responsible for FIELDHOME's existence and mission. In 1879 Sister Louise and two friends opened The House of the Holy Comforter, Free Church Home for Incurables, in Manhattan.

The ceremony was held at Field Hall on FIELDHOME's campus. In 1879 Cortlandt de Peyster Field founded **The Catharine Fieldhome** in memory of his mother, Catharine (hence the name of our street, Catherine Street – now spelled with an *e* instead of an *a*). He, along with other volunteer trustees, began a mission of caring for elderly women on our campus in the grand stately white building we now refer to as Field Hall.



The House of the Holy Comforter merged with The Catharine Fieldhome in 1986. It is with great pride that we at FIELDHOME continue to carry on the commitment of Sister Louise and Cortlandt de Peyster Field and we look forward to the continued advancement of their mission, which has remained unchanged for the past 130 years: *To provide the loving care we would want for ourselves at any age.*



The FIELDHOME campus now includes a rehabilitation treatment center and a skilled nursing facility at Field Home—Holy Comforter and offers luxury assisted living and memory support at The Seabury. FIELDHOME residents also benefit from a unique on-campus intergenerational program with the children from The Early Learning Center.
